

# "OPEN BREAK" AT POOL.

## Champion Keogh Would Do Away with Safety Play to Interest Spectators.

Jerome R. Keogh, the pool champion, has a new "open break," which he believes will add new life to the game. He says:

"It is simply in the difference in the break that the game varies from the regular one. The balls at first are broken as usual, and when all but one have been pocketed the frame is racked up again and the player shoots the last ball of the frame in and breaks the bunch. He keeps on shooting until he misses.

"I believe that the open break not only will improve the game for spectators, but also will result in the establishment of runs and averages that would indicate relative abilities of players, as is now the case in billiards. It will do away with the safety play."

## Clinton Wins Shoot by One Point.

The rifle match between teams from the High School of Commerce and De Witt Clinton High School at the latter's range yesterday afternoon was won by the Clinton team by the score of 267 to 266. The match was decided by the last shot. Barcel, Black, and Hubbard turned in perfect scores for Clinton, and this saved their team from defeat, as three of their mates made scores of 32.
