Learn the angles and pace of shots with this **practice** routine. Believe me you'll be a master after **practicing** this one

The object is to pot black. But black is in the middle of the pack. Place the triangle of the **reds** and a black such that the black ball is on the pink spot. Place the white anywhere on the table, but you must come off **three** cushions - one of which must be the baulk cushion - to **split** the pack. You can use more than three cushions, but no fewer. Pick up the white if you want to after every shot and place it where you like. But it must come off three cushions.

Gradually maneuver the black into pocket A. Following figure shows the best way to do this, but it gets very difficult if the black strays into the shaded area. Its difficult practice but it will give your **game** shear strength for sure. You'll then **perfectly judge** angles and speed of cue ball
