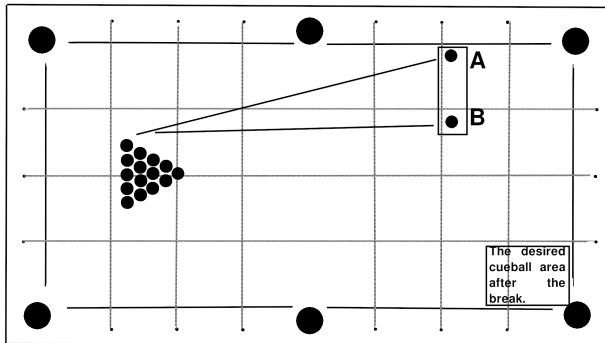

## Strokes in 14.1

### Breakshot Exercises

14.1 is a cuesport that has clear differences from other cue games. The 14.1 break is not meant to be broken like in 8, 9 or 10 ball. The 14.1 break is a defensive break. The ideal 14.1 break leaves the opponent no open shot on the table or no clear path to a runout. This exercise is about controlled power and cueball position. Start practicing the opening break at position A or B, aim for the right most ball in the last row of the rack. First learn the power needed to get to cueball in the desired area. An ideal situation is to freeze the cueball on the shelf of the corner pocket. Next learn how to strike the rack to make two balls hit a rail. The goal is to have the two wing balls, the right most and left most balls in the last row of the rack to return back after each hits a rail.

A defensive break is unique to 14.1, when you practice you want to develop a controlled stroke. Note the differences when you under and over hit the ball. Your developing a stroke with controlled power. Practice this shot 10 times in your routine until you can play 7 out of 10 times consistently.
